In Cooperstown we'll relive our greatest baseball memories and discover an historic all-American village.

Nestled between the foothills of the Catskill and Adirondack Mountain ranges, Cooperstown is home to baseball, and so much more. **The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum** offers fans of all ages a memorable journey through baseball history. In 1907, it was determined that the origin of baseball occurred in Cooperstown. The museum completed a \$21 million renovation in 2005 and houses awesome collections and exhibitions that very appropriately make it a very special place.



After the museum we can check out Cooperstown's memorabilia shops and **Doubleday Field** (where baseball was first played).

We'll also visit the **Heroes of Baseball Wax Museum**. This one-of-a-kind museum has three levels of wax figures, a virtual reality batting cage, and more. We can even take a tour of **The**

Cooperstown Bat Company and watch artisans customize high-quality bats.

On one afternoon, we'll enjoy a cruise on the historic **Erie Canal**. We'll actually travel through a 100 year old lock and hear the history of the canal--from its inception in 1826 through its continued use today. It's an experience we won't soon forget.
